Thank you for your correspondence of June 3, 2008 and follow up phone call regarding the horse "Capone".

Further to your request, the information that appears in the FEI Passport regarding ownership was changed to Corrine Super on May 25, 2005. The change of ownership followed Equine Canada Rule A412.8. Ms. Super, through her business Fairway Farms Ltd submitted a letter to Equine Canada indicating that there was a change of ownership in the horse. She sent to Equine Canada the FEI passport for Capone and the appropriate fees. The ownership was adjusted in our records and the amended passport was returned to Ms. Super.

The FEI Passport for Capone which is issued by Equine Canada, on behalf of the FEI, displays a record of information about the horse that is reported to Equine Canada by an owner. The system of issuing and amending passports is based on self-reported information. Equine Canada does not independently validate horse ownership. Equine Canada does not evaluate commercial transactions or title issues relating to the purported sale of a horse.

While passports are a means to identify an owner for the purposes of competitions, they alone (for the reasons set out above) are not legally determinative as to ownership. An FEI passport is not conclusive proof of ownership nor is it equivalent to a bill of sale.

We trust this answers your questions.
